Crocker Presbyterian Church Crocker, Missouri



The Crocker church has a unique witness in their area, including Fort Leonard Wood army base. The congregation includes families of long tenure and also families passing through in their military service. Session has approved ZOOM live broadcasts for Sunday service and Adult Sunday School. Our ZOOM following is expanding to members and friends of the congregation outside of the state of Missouri. Each week attendance has been increasing.

Starting the week of April 5th a daily devotional, Thoughts for the Day, is sent out to the congregation.

Session members and pastor are consistently contacting members of the congregation through phone calls, emails, text message and or ZOOM.

Starting the week of April 12 on Tuesday evenings a weekly ZOOM one-hour broadcast with focus on Bible study and once a month fun evening on ZOOM for the church family.

Crocker houses the food bank for the community, as part of the Ministerial Alliance. Convoy of Hope is delivering pallets of food and other items to our church for distribution, besides other donations coming in to the church.

Several women in the church are making surgical masks to be distributed to the community, hospital, and others as requested

Each week with this pandemic we are finding lots of changes and a new normal for the church family, but we focus on showing gratitude, love, compassion and prayers for the church family and community.

FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH FORT SCOTT, KANSAS

Here in Fort Scott we are missing one another's faces, singing together, laughter and even small talk over refreshments. We have established some simple rhythms. We post a video of our liturgy/prayers, and a separate video of a short sermon, to our youtube channel. We mail a print copy of the liturgy and the sermon to all who choose to receive it that way. We adjusted our April Food Drive away from bringing food items to pile at the front of the sanctuary (we often pit one section of pews against another in friendly competition!). Instead, we will collect financial gifts.

For Palm Sunday we will have palm branches for those who want to do a "driving palm parade" through our neighborhood. Then (one family at a time), we'll place the palms in the cross on our front lawn (as is our custom). On Maundy Thursday we'll do "drive through communion" in front of the church and drape our cross in black cloth. On Easter morning, we'll again offer drive through communion and invite the congregation to bring fresh flowers to place in the cross (a beloved tradition here).

Our Sunday morning book discussion of Brene Brown's *The Gifts of Imperfection* has moved to an email format. We are calling and checking on one another as best we can. We are trying to receive each day as it comes, looking forward to a time when we can be physically together again.

Five Ways To Be The Church When Church Is Canceled BY <u>ERIN WATHEN</u> (edited version)

Of all the cancellations, perhaps the most unnerving of all is the call, in many areas, to cancel church worship services. This seems counterintuitive in a time when people are anxious and need community; when people are facing economic uncertainty and need support; and when people are fearful and need the comfort of prayer and connection. And yet- we have to acknowledge that "large gatherings" are a hotspot for the spread of disease, and that church services can be pretty cozy experiences as far as personal space goes There is unprecedented territory ahead, and nobody can say how long it might last here are some things to remember, Support your pastors. Know that they heavily weighed consequences, including your disappointment, and ultimately did what they thought was the best thing for the wellbeing of the community. Thank them for having your best interests at heart, Send in your pledge. This may seem like a small thing in the grand scheme Even if the building is empty, bills and salaries need to be paid; what's more, you're helping your church maintain mission commitments to the community in a time when that commitment is more important than ever. Check on your neighbors. Any time you help someone in your proximity, you are living out the values of your faith community. You are embodying what the whole gospel thing is about, which takes church out of the building and brings it to life for others. This is what we go to church to learn how to do- it is 'for such a time as this' that you have spent all those other Sundays in worship. Pray for your church family. And send notes. Make phone calls. We are one body, even when that body is not together in the flesh. Practice Sabbath. For some, this shutdown of life as we know it is going to cause significant economic hardship. Keep perspective and recognize that downtime can be a gift.

PULPIT SUPPLY for a minister leading worship and preaching for a congregation as a visiting minister should ordinarily receive \$100.00, plus the IRS approved mileage amount per vouchered mile (2019 IRS rate \$0.575 per mile). Pulpit Supply is \$100.00 with the understanding that is only if one (1) service is to be prepared. It was approved by COM that if two (2) services are required the honorarium would be \$150.00. If overnight lodging is required, motel and meals should be provided at the church's expense. Honorarium for moderating a session is \$50 plus the IRS approved mileage rate per vouchered mile.
